# Robinson nearly swings it

# Woo-burned by Dean

Cookham get better of rivals Narks in clash of promotion chasers

A lost toss saw the home side bat and they struggled early on as Cookham's useful seam attack extracted plenty of movement from the pitch.

However, James White battled through to make a well-earned 50, while Mark Tennant (52) and Dave Small (34) provided the crucial middle-order acceleration which saw Wooburn add 78 in the last 10 overs to finish on 197-9.

Tennant then excelled with ball as he secured an early breakthrough at the start of Cookham's reply.

But the early success proved not to be a sign of things to come as the Wooburn's bowlers struggled to get the same amount of movement as their opponents had earlier in the day.

# Fisher and Bath drop hosts in deep end

A SLOW, damp pitch put bowlers in the ascendancy throughout **Little Marlow's** 36-run win over hosts **Little Kingshill** on Saturday.

The visitors suffered the early departure of Dave Armitage before Iain Angus dropped anchor while Anwar Mahmood and Tahir Rashid attacked when they could.

Rashid's 25 proved to be the innings' top score, and after he was third out at 66, Little Marlow lost eight wickets for 29 runs as they were skittled for just 95. Ilyas took 5-2 in 5.2 overs.

Accurate bowling from Mark Fisher and Mike Bath ensured that a total of 95 was more than sufficient.

A second wicket stand of 21 was Kingshill's highest before they were bundled out for 59. Fisher claimed 6-31 and Bath 4-17.

■ **Little Marlow 2nds** made a disastrous start to their match versus **Denham 2nds** before recovering to win by 50 runs.

Poorly chosen and badly executed shots against good new ball bowling from Jack Grover and Kirby established a near terminal collapse for the hosts.

At 32-5 they were looking down the barrel. Fortunately, in Steve Shore (55 not out) they had just the right man for a crisis.

He and Danny Finlay (36) put their heads down and mounted a rescue act, and with the lower order chipping in, the innings closed on 164-8.

Denham lost wickets at regular intervals until, at 81-6, obdurate opener Tang (42) appeared to be the only obstacle between Little Marlow and the winning line.

When he was finally

dismissed the rest of the innings folded apart from a 10th wicket rearguard which was eventually polished
